### FAST HIGHLIGHTING ADDRESS BAR IN SAFARI, FREE TIPS ABOUT WHAT WILL HAPPEN WHEN YOU CLICK AN INTERNET LINK

When you use Safari, Mac's browser software, to get on the Internet, it feels slow and clumsy to drag your cursor over the existing address to highlight it so you can enter a new address. There's an easier way.

Just hold down the Command key and press the letter L. When you do that, the current URL address field will highlight, and you're ready to type in a new address. Tiger also has a built-in tip finder in Safari. To use it, from within Safari click on view and then click on show status bar. Now, whenever you place our cursor over a link on a web page, it shows you what will happen when you click that link. And there's more.

Hold down a modifier key (Command, Option, Shift, Control, etc.) and then take a look at the status bar (at the bottom of your screen) and you'll see even more information on your status bar.

This is a neat trick, and mixing and combining those modifier keys when you move your cursor over a link and all kinds of cool tips are available.
