START AN APPLICATION AT LOGIN

If there is a particular application program you use every time you start your Mac, Tiger makes it easy to auto-start that program every time you turn on your Mac. Here's how it's done.

With the application open, hold down the Control key and click on the Doc icon, or just click on the Doc icon and hold the mouse button down.

From the pop-up menu, choose Open at Login, and from now on, every time you start your Mac, That application will run.

You can see a list of things that always start when you turn Mac on, by opening System Preferences (It's in the Doc, or you can click on the Apple icon on the upper left corner of your screen and find it there) and then opening the Accounts icon. In the Accounts pane, click on the Login items tab.

From there, you can add or delete an item by highlighting it and clicking on the + or - below the item list. You can also click on the Hide checkbox next to an application's name to hide the application until you click on it in the Doc.
