QUICKLY FIND WEB SITES YOU VISITED

Like any browser, the Mac browser, Safari, collects information to track where you've been on the Internet, page by page.

If you want to quickly revisit a page you that you have recently visited, just click-and-hold on the Back button, which is a left arrow, on the Safari toolbar. The Web sites that you visited will appear in a contextual menu.

If you "hopped" backward, you can go forward clicking- and-holding on the Next button, the right arrow on the same toolbar.

This is an easy and very fast way to work back and forth between Web sites you visit.
