KEEP YOURSELF INVISIBLE WHILE HANGING OUT, ON THE NET

If you tend to keep your Mac turned on and logged on to the Internet with your high-speed DSL or cable connection, you could be at risk. The good news is that you can make your Mac invisible while it "hangs out" on the Net.

Start by opening the System Preferences icon, which you will find on your Doc at the bottom of your screen. Or, click on the Apple icon at the top left side of your screen and pick System Preferences from the drop-down menu. In the "Internet & Network" section open the Sharing folder.

Now click on the Firewall tab and then on the advanced button. Put a check mark in the "Enable Stealth Mode" box and close out. That's it, you're finished. Now your Mac will not respond to Internet traffic, and won't even acknowledge that your computer exists.
