MAKE TIGER MULTI-LINGUAL

Tiger lets you apply language preferences to Apple's applications individually. For example, you can set Mail's Autocorrect Spelling feature to French (for your e-mail messages to distant relatives) while keeping the Finder in English. Here's how to set it up:

Go to the International preference pane and click on the Input Menu tab. Select the language(s) you want to add - French, in this case. Now enable the Allow A Different Input Source For Each Document option at the bottom of the window.

Move to Mail and create a new message. Enter the French text you want. When Mail places a red line under the foreign words to signal that they are not in the dictionary, just control-click on the underline, choose Spelling from the contextual menu, and then choose Français from the Dictionary pop-up menu. It's that easy.
