

## **MAC LESSON #57**

### **BOOT WITH YOUR REMOTE CONTROL**

Now that you can buy Mac computers powered by Intel chips, you can download a program called "Boot Camp" from the Apple Web site (it's free) and after loading it on your Intel-powered Mac, you can install a full version of Windows XP. Now you have a choice. You can boot up into either operating system, Mac OS X or Windows XP.

Normally, you would have to use your keyboard to select the operating system you want to work with. But wait. You can actually use the remote control that came with your Intel-based Mac.

To select the your Mac boot drive of choice with the Apple Remote, just press and hold the included remotes "Menu" button just after you hear the startup chime of your Mac.

Then when the startup drive selections appear use the "forward/backward" buttons to select the corresponding volume and then press "play" to boot from that volume.

Now is that cool or what?
