KEYBOARD VOLUME CHANGE WITHOUT THE BEEP

When you use your keyboard to change your Mac's volume setting or turn the volume mute on or off, the Mac emits an annoying sound, something like a robot duck might sound like. This auto feedback can be useful at times, but it can also be annoying when you are trying to work quietly. There is a way to silence that sound. It's easy.

Just hold down the Shift key while you press the volume-up, the volume-down or the Mute key. Note that this doesn't work when you use your Mouse to select the volume menu on the right side of the menu bar.

If your Mac notebook requires the use of the Fn (Function) key, that's OK - holding down the Shift key still silences that awful noise.
