MAKE FONTS LOOK THEIR BEST ON YOUR SCREEN

Mac OS X does a special brand of font-smoothing to make your fonts look crisp and clean onscreen. But you can tweak the method OS X uses to smooth your fonts to give you the best possible look, depending on which type of monitor (flat panel, CRT, etc.) you're using with your Mac.

To choose which style of font smoothing works best for your monitor, Open the Apple menu and then open System Preferences. Click on the Appearance icon. In the Appearance options, in the bottom section, you can choose the Font smoothing style your Mac uses. Select from Automatic, Standard (best for CRT), light, medium (best for LCD flat panel) and strong.

Let your eyes be the judge of the setting that works best for you.
