### **GET THE INSIDE SCOOP ON YOUR FONT**

Most of us only use a handful of fonts in our everyday work with our computers. A font is a specific size and style of type within a type family. There are tons of fonts contained in what Apple calls the Font Book. The Font Book knows much more than just how many fonts your Mac has and what kind they are. To access Font Book click on Go and then open Applications.

Now open Font Book. To pull up all of the info Font Book knows about a given font, highlight it, hold down the Command key, and press the letter I.

Now you'll see things like a Font's full name, the languages it's used in, the version number you have, the location of that Font on your computer, and even copyright and trademark information.
