EASILY COPY LARGE BLOCKS OF TEXT IN SAFARI

If you use Apple's Safari Web browser to view the Internet, you'll notice that when you click on a block of text, you really don't see a "cursor", but you can click and drag to highlight or select text. That doesn't mean you can't easily copy large blocks of Internet text using Safari. Here's how it's done.

Place your mouse cursor just to the left of the first letter of the text you wish to highlight, and then click. Now move your cursor to the end of the text you want to copy, hold down the Shift key and click. Use your scroll bar to get from one end of your selection to the other. It's easier than dragging the cursor all that way and waiting for it to auto scroll.

If you just want to select a single word, double-click on it. Triple-click to select an entire paragraph.
