REDUCE AMBIENT NOISE WHEN RECORDING WITH A MACBOOK OR MACBOOK PRO

If you use your MacBook or MacBook Pro with OS 10.4.8 to record your voice, the microphone you use could accidentally pick up sounds in your environment. There is a very easy way to prevent that from happening.

Open System Preferences (in the Dock) and then open Sound, located in the Hardware section. Now click on the Input tab, and then click in the box to the left of Use ambient noise reduction, located just below the Input volume slider. Close out and you're done. Your microphone won't pick up any ambient sounds when you record your next project on your Mac laptop.
