FINDING WIFI SPOTS WITH AN IPHONE

The new Apple iPhone uses AT&T's Edge network AND WiFi where available to give you access to the Internet and e-mail. That's fine if you know where the WiFi spots are in your neighborhood. But what if you don't? Well the iPhone has a solution.

Open the Maps icon on your iPhone and type in WiFi followed by a space and the Zip code you happen to be in. If you don't know it, ask someone. Now press Search.

Your iPhone will pop up a list of free (from the most part) WiFi spots designated by what look like red pins in a map. You can also press Satellite to get a satellite picture of that area.

The iPhone can usually give you full contact information about places it finds. What more could you ask for?
