SYSTEM CONFIGURATION FILE IN WIN 98

NEW MOUSE

Windows 98 has a utility called System Configuration Utility that allows you to turn off any annoying auto-start programs using check boxes to select and deselect those items. Here's how to use it.

Click on Start, then Programs, then Accessories. Now select System Tools, and System Information. Now click on Tools, then select System Configuration Utility. Click on the Startup tab and you'll find a list of all of the programs that start when Windows 98 starts. You can turn any program on or off with the check mark.

Windows 95 has several extra mouse pointers available, including some that are animated. You'll need your Windows 95 CD-ROM disk. Here's how to find them.

Open Control Panel and select Add/Remove Programs. Click on the Windows Setup tab, and double-click Accessories. Now select Mouse Pointers, click on OK twice, and insert the Windows 95 CD-ROM when asked.

Once installed, you can use these new pointers by opening the Control Panel and double-clicking on Mouse. Select the Pointers tab and you'll be presented with a list of currently selected pointers. Click on the pointer you would like to change (such as Normal Select) and click on Browse. You'll find a list of new pointers. The .ani files are animated. Each new pointer you highlight will be previewed in the Preview box. Be sure to click on Apply or OK when you are finished.

Windows 98 has a large selection of mouse pointers available after /a normal upgrade or install.
