### **FIND & USE NEW DESKTOP ICONS**

### **AUTO DIAL YOUR ISP**

If you're tired of the same old icons on your Windows 98 Desktop you're in luck. Windows 98 includes more icons that Windows 95 did. Here's how to access them.

Right-click on the Shortcut on which you want to change icons. Click on Properties and then select Change Icon. In the File Name box you can overtype C:\WINDOWS\SYSTEM\SHELL32.DLL. Now press the Enter key or click on OK. Select your new icon by clicking on it and then clicking OK.

Both the 95 and 98 versions of Windows also have more icons in a file called MORICONS.DLL so now you can overtype C:\WINDOWS\MORICONS.DLL in the File Name box.

If you use Dial-Up Network to call into the Internet you may, from time to time, experience busy signals. Windows Dial-up Network can redial that number until it connects. Here's how to set that up.

Double-click on My Computer and then on Dial-up Network. Highlight the Dial-up connection that you'll be using and click on Connections on the Menu bar. Select Settings and then click on Redial to open the redial dialog box. Now you can select the number of times Windows will redial before giving up, and the length of time, in minutes and seconds, before the next attempt.
