### **CHANGE YOUR SCREEN SETTINGS FROM YOUR TASK BAR A NEW USE FOR YOUR DIGITAL CAMERA**

The way to look at and change Windows screen settings is to right-click on your Desktop, click on Properties and then click on the Settings tab. At that point you can change things like the the color settings and the screen resolution in terms of size. There is an Advanced button in the Display Properties window which gives you access to several specific settings that deal with your monitor, performance factors and many others.

On the first display page of the Advanced setting button you'll find a box next to "Show settings icon on task bar" and if you click in that box, you'll place a checkmark in it. The new icon on your task bar will give you direct access to your screen settings. No more right clicking and tab selecting. This tip works in Windows 98 and Windows ME.

If you own a digital camera that has an LCD screen on the back, you can take pictures of error messages that pop up on your computer screen as you try to install new software, or any other error for that matter. If you have to take your computer in for service, or if you have to talk with a tech support person, you'll be able to replay each screen picture so that the repair tech will know exactly what error messages you got and when you got them.
