ADD ADDITIONAL TIME ZONES TO YOUR COMPUTER'S CLOCK

One feature has been present in several previous versions of Windows is the ubiquitous clock - the time of day as it were, that you find in the lower right side of your screen you can double-click on the time to get access to the time and date settings what Windows is keeping track of while you're using your Windows-equipped computer once opened, you can reset the date or time. In fact, you can have your computer sync its time with the Atomic clock every time you go on the Internet.

It's easy. Just go to www.worldtimeserver.com/atomic-clock and follow the easy instructions.

Now Vista lets you keep a total of three clicks, each set to whatever time zone you specify. Here's how it's done.

Click on Start and, then on Control Panel. Now open the Date and Time icon in the Control Panel applet and open the "Additional Clocks" tab. There, you can configure two more clocks and assign each its own time zone.

They'll appear in the tooltip when you hover over the Taskbar clock. It's perfect because you don't have to install any software or place a "gadget" in your Sidebar.
