MAKE VISTA GO FASTER

Some of you tell me that the Vista computer you just started using seems slower than the Windows XP computer that you were using before you made the switch to Vista.

The reason may be that by default, a power setting available through the Control Panel is set in a "Power Saving" mode that, while it saves power, reduces the performance of your Vista computer's CPU or main chip. To pump up your computer's performance, do this:

Click on Start and then open the Control Panel. Now click on Power Options. If you don't see this icon click on Classic View in the upper left corner of the Control Panel window.

Now click next to High Performance to remove the "Power Saving" mode. Close Control Panel and enjoy your new-found speed and power.
